

Mik Carraro – Thank you for being the dedicated person you are – I think I know when you don't say a lot, things are good!



Unfortunately, it wasn't our day that day. But to see the determination in this bunch in the last round really stood out to me. To be involved with this squad, who really didn't have their odds in their favour at the beginning of the year to even be a chance of making semi's is, and will always be one of my personal football highlights for as long as I am involved with this game.
